Increasing the impact of Health Integration Teams (HITs)

Support HITs to develop applied health research projects with the new NIHR Applied Research Collaboration (ARC)

Support the development of new HITs such as an Adverse Childhood Experiences HIT, ensuring the model evolves with system requirements

Strengthening HIT success in engaging with Black and minority ethnic communities

Raise the profile of HITs and extend their membership, for example to include North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Public Health
