## Helpful and unhelpful therapist behaviours in psychological therapies for eating disorders

## Background and Aims

- Outcomes in evidence-based ED therapies vary widely accross individuals
- Some do very well, but early termination and poor outcomes are common
- Therapist behaviours are a modifiable factor
- Aims:
  - Identify helpful/unhelpful therapist actions
  - Theorise their impact on change
  - Use to create clinician training guidance

### Current study

#### Interview study

- 20-25 participants with lived experience of ED therapy
- Semi-structured interviews about therapist behaviours and their effects
- Constructivist grounded theory analysis

#### Survey

- Aim for 30 participants with lived experience of ED therapy
- Online survey asks about therapist factors indentified as helpful/ unhelpful in previous research
- Asks if therapist did this, specific examples, and was it important



### Planned next steps

#### Co-produce therapist checklist/guidance

- Plan for workshops with clinicians and people with lived experience
- Use data from studies and literature review
- Turn into useable guidance and tools

#### Test guidance

- Implement guidance and see if it impacts on:
  - Therapists behaviours
  - Early therapy outcomes

## Help needed!

  - Have had any kind of psychological therapy for ED in last three years
  - At least four sessions with same therapist, with any outcome
- Share information about study with people who could take part.
- More diverse voices particularly needed!
